BLIND SPORT NZ ANNUAL REPORT JULY/JULY











OVERVIEW



We had two new staff members begin in August 2022, the General Manager and a new position for Blind Sport NZ (BSNZ), a Community and Programme Lead. The new position meant we increased capacity and the number of activations in the sector and community. The feedback we have been receiving after these activations suggest our work is of a high standard.

Fostering good partnerships and working in collaboration has been the key to the success we have had this year. It was difficult to find baseline data on existing partnerships, so we created a sector matrix and used this to track the engagement level with partners as it changed over time. There was a notable increase in the number of groups we engaged with and in the quality of engagement.

One constant this year has been the need to increase the awareness and presence of BSNZ in the sector. We have been chipping away at this through more regular communication over the phone or email, through our social media platform, attending sport and disability huis or network opportunities and partnering with regional groups to jointly deliver sport events or training.

As a result of conversations with sector and community groups we identified a gap in skills, knowledge, experience and resources around visual impairment in sport. There was an appetite for support and to address this we created basic VI training material. We delivered training and education sessions, in person and virtually, to our sport sector coaches and officials as well as education and service sector providers.

In the more recent months we have reached out to our international blind sport colleagues and are getting underway with a project to share knowledge and ideas around best practice models.

To round off what has been a busy year, we reviewed and updated a number of our governing documents, i.e. our Constitution and Strategic Plan to set the platform for the forthcoming year/s.
